Dogs that come into "rescue" come in all shapes, sizes, colors and breeds. They often times also come with a variety of maladies. We like the easily treatable ones like fleas or ear mites. One of the most dreaded words for us to hear is "HEARTWORM POSITIVE".

Heartworm is a parasitic roundworm transmitted to their host through a mosquito bite. Preventing heartworm disease is easy with a monthly preventative, treating it however is NOT. The treatment period can take months, the dog also receives multiple injections by the spine of an arsenic-based drug, crate rest is a must, and the expense can run very high.

Meet Rollo, a bullmastiff mix and Larry, a handsome Shepherd mix. Both pups came from animal controls and were surrendered for unknown reasons. Both dogs are also sadly, heartworm positive. Can you help?
